Cabinets Carpet (900 sq. ft = approx. 3300 lbs.) Concrete (1 cubic yard = approx. 3300 lbs.) Doors Drywall (47 sheets = approx. 3300 lbs.) Insulation Flooring Hardwood Flooring (1280 sq. ft = approx. 3300 lbs.) Packaging materials Paneling Plaster Plywood Rock (1 cubic yard = approx. 3300 lbs.) Roofing Screens Siding Sinks Soil (1 cubic yard = approx. 3300 lbs.) Tile (900 sq. ft = approx. 3300 lbs.) Toilets Trim materials Wall studs (180 = approx. 3300 lbs.)
